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## Visual Case Analysis (VCA) Practice Exercise 2

These practice exercises are intended for participants of the NCSD DIS VCA Training session held in July 2022. ## Prior to practicing, you will need:

Colored pencils (preferably erasable) – black, red, green, orange, blue
Black marker or ink pen
Infectious Syphilis Epidemiologic Analysis Chart (12 months) – printed on legal size paper (preferably the one you started in Exercise 1)
VCA Pocket Assistant

## **Practice Exercises**

Johannes York tested positive for syphilis on 4/6/2022. He came into the STD clinic for testing and preventative treatment after being notified by a Disease Intervention Specialist at the county health department that he may have been exposed to syphilis. During the appointment, Johannes also had an HIV-1 antibody test (blood sample) that was negative, and a chlamydia/gonorrhea NAAT (urine sample) that was also negative.

Johannes presented to the STD clinic with a rash on his hands and feet. When the rash was pointed out to Johannes, he said he had noticed it but thought it was related to his seasonal allergies. He had not tried any over-the-counter medications to deal with it. Johannes stated the rash had been present for about 25 days. The physician orders Johannes to receive Bicillin that day and diagnoses him with secondary syphilis based on his symptom presentation and known exposure.

He receives Bicillin 2.4 mu x1 dose on 4/6/2022. He schedules a future appointment to have his RPR drawn again in 3 months. Upon further review of Johannes' STD history, it's discovered that he previously reports having sex with both men and women and was last tested in August 2021 – at that time, Johannes was negative for chlamydia/gonorrhea (urine and rectal sample), HIV-1 antibody (blood sample), and had a negative RPR. His reason for testing on 8/10/2021 was listed as routine screening of man who has sex with men. At that visit, he reported having oral and vaginal sex with 1 female partner, and oral and anal sex with male partners. He reports living at home with his girlfriend. He feels safe at home. He reports his girlfriend is not pregnant.



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<u>Exercise 1:</u> Review Johannes' VCA. What do you need to add to it, given the information you've discovered during pre-interview analysis?

Johannes returns to the clinic and speaks to the DIS on 4/11/2022, 4 days after his positive labs resulted. During the interview, Johannes becomes distraught. He has been in a relationship for 3 years with his girlfriend, so the news of testing positive for syphilis has been an upset for him. He is initially hesitant to discuss his sexual partners. However, after you confront him about his sexual partners from the previous August and inform him of the risk of congenital syphilis, he begins to give you information.

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Johannes was very adamant that Carmela could not know about his additional sex partners, who both are male. You reassured him that you legally could not tell Carmela his private health information but took the opportunity to remind him the risk he is putting Carmela at by not informing her of his additional sex partners. You asked Johannes if he remembers seeing any sores on his partners and showed him the picture cards, and Johannes explains that his long-time sex partner, Ryan, had a sore on his mouth around Christmas the last time they had sex. Johannes remembers this because Ryan wouldn't let Johannes kiss him, stating it was a cold sore, but did perform oral sex on him while the sore was present. Johannes did not note any other partners with symptoms.

You call the two male partners the next day and inform them of their exposure. They both agree to come to the STD clinic to be screened and to receive preventative treatment. Review their labs, treatment, and symptoms below:
